
Tips for Printing and Use

- Print in landscape.
- Use heavy weight paper.
- Laminate the cards so that they hold up over time.
- Use just one card at a station with the appropriate materials. Rotate the card and materials out when you want to change it up!
- Use the blank cards to write in your own challenge, or add a Velcro® sticky dot to a material and to the card, and stick one of your materials to the card itself.
